Our Mission: Sherman Lake YMCA Outdoor Center puts Honesty, Caring, Respect, and Responsibility (HCRR) into programs that build a healthy spirit, mind, and body for all. We are an inclusive organization that welcomes all, regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, or disability.

- HCRR (pronounced "Hick-er") is a part of everything we do! You will definitely hear about these core values when they get home!
- We are proud partners with <u>Kulture City</u>, an organization that promotes inclusion for those with sensory needs and invisible disabilities.
- Overnight campers have the option of an all-gender cabin. This is open to all, no matter their gender or identity. No matter what cabin/group your camper is in, privacy and personal boundaries are a standard expectation! You can read more about Safety & Equity policies here!
- Every week, each cabin or day camp group will create a "Community Commitment" with their counselors. This is a group agreement of expectations for all to feel safe and a sense of belonging while here. If it's repeatedly broken by a camper, they may be dismissed from Camp.
- Our goal is "Success for Every Camper!" And success looks differently for everyone.
 Please fill out your Camper Forms at least two weeks prior to Camp so we can best
 serve your camper and their needs. Our Camper Services team will give you a call if
 needed to talk about strategies and resources to best support your camper.
- Our programs are not designed for those needing significant assistance in personal care, those that have difficulty managing their behavior in group settings, or require constant one-on-one support from our staff.
